


### What is a Family-School Compact?

Effective Compacts:

- Focus on Student Learning Skills
- Describe how Teachers will help students using high-quality instruction.
- Share Specific Strategies parents can use at home.
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress.
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom.

## LMS 7th Grade Students

LMS students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed and reach for the stars in English language arts and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Complete homework/classwork on time.
- Study at home for tests/quizzes.
- Work on i-Ready Math and Reading Plus.
- Ask for help.
- Watch videos of concepts I do not understand.
- Student needs to check grades and assignments in Infinite Campus to complete any missing assignments.

## In 7th Grade Classrooms

The 7th grade teams will work with students and their families to support students' success in all English language arts and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Use Remind for math and English language arts information.
- Offer and participate in Title I math and English language arts events to give parents ways to help their child in math and English language arts.
- Make Phone calls to parents and Email parents about their child.
- Review student progress on IC and Portal, discuss with students, and contact other student teachers for assistance when needed.

## At Home

- Access the Parent Portal and should regularly check to see that their student is completing the work in a satisfactory manner.
- Ask your student daily about the school day.
- Work with teachers to support student success.
